Serving Our Environment

Paper, Cardboard, Newspaper, Magazines

Please bag or bundle all paper separately from other recyclables. Cardboard must be packed in small 2'x2'x2' bundles or smaller & tied. When using a dual sort cart, cardboard & paper do not need to be bundled.

Yes Boxes, paper bags, paperboard boxes (i.e. cereal, cracker, shoeboxes, etc.), paper egg cartons, paper tubes (i.e. wrapping or toilet paper tubes), junk mail, magazines, books (no hard covers), envelopes, newspaper, office paper & cardboard.

No Waxed or plastic coated paper or cardboard, paper towels or tissues, wrapping paper, food soiled paper, blue print or carbon paper, milk or juice cartons.

Glass

Please rinse all containers prior to placing in recycling.

Yes Bottles & jars.

No Plate glass, Pyrex, ceramics, mirrors, light bulbs, dinnerware or windows.

Metals

Please rinse all containers prior to placing in recycling.

Yes Aluminum & tin food cans, bimetal cans, aluminum foil & aluminum pie plates.

No Juice bags, hangers, paint cans, pressurized aerosol cans, propane tanks.

* Note: hangers, empty paint cans, empty aerosol cans & scrap metals of aluminum, copper or brass may be brought to the Marin Recycling Center.

Plastic

Please rinse all bottles & remove all lids prior to placing in recycling.

Yes All plastic containers labeled #1-7 in the triangular arrows.*

No Plastic bags, packaging, shrink-wrap, Styrofoam, plastic utensils or dishes, straws and NO compostable/bio plastic.

*Marin Sanitary Service discourages the use or purchase of any plastic packaging due to its environmental impacts and unstable recycling markets.

Yard Waste

Yes Grass clippings, leaves, weeds, tree & shrub clippings, branches under 4' in length & 3" in diameter.

No Dirt, treated wood, rubbish, concrete, rocks, pet waste, food waste, pottery, plastic, metal or glass. Do not put yard waste in plastic bags.
